The 2025 Northeast Regional (Region 1) Soil Judging Contest was hosted by the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown on October 8–10. The first two days consisted of 10 practice pits at two separate locations, the University Campus and Gallitzin State Forest. The contest day was held at Laurel Hill State Park in Somerset County, Pennsylvania. This contest highlighted the variety of Ultisols in the Allegheny Mountain section of the Appalachian Plateau Physiographic Province.

With 13 schools participating and 101 student contestants, this was the largest Region 1 Soil Judging Contest in recent memory. We are pleased with the growing interest in soil science, welcoming new teams from many smaller universities.
