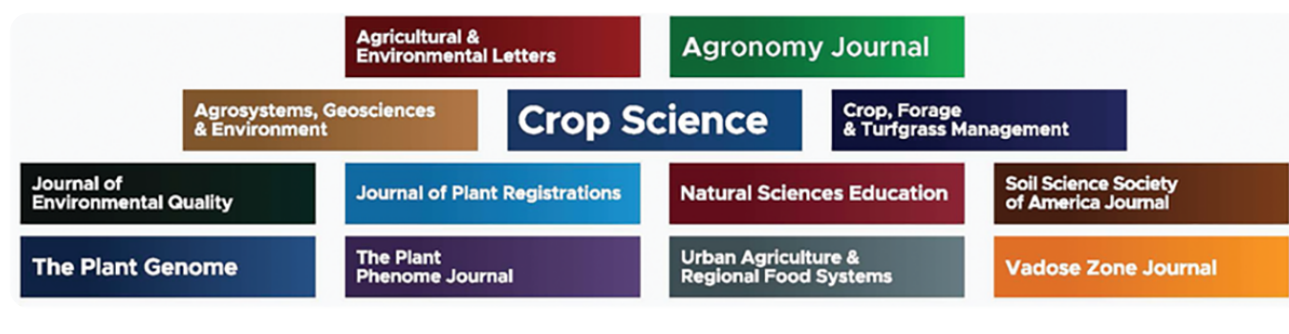


# Climate change virtual issue underway

## All society journals to publish papers on adaption, mitigation strategies

Development is underway for the virtual issue entitled “Advancing Resilient Agricultural Systems: Adapting to and Mitigating Climate Change” across all journals published by ASA, CSSA, and SSSA. We seek to explore the latest research investigating strategies to adapt to and mitigate climate change. Innovation and imagination backed by good science are encouraged as are diverse voices and perspectives in the potential papers. Documenting our progress in understanding the impact of climate change on agricultural systems and taking a forward look on how we can address those

challenges is one goal of this virtual issue.

Guest editors to help facilitate this effort have been busy refining the topics and identifying potential authors for the commissioned articles.
