Here's a preview of the sessions you'll see in November.

Graduate Student Leadership Conference

When: Saturday, 6 November and Sunday, 7 November

Graduate students attending the leadership conference will receive professional development training on research ethics, professional etiquette, networking, and communication. Students will also participate in a personality assessment to learn about their strengths and traits to build more effective working relationships. Graduate students will also participate in "Lunch with the Leadership" where they will have the opportunity to network with ASA, CSSA, and SSSA past, present, and future presidents. The leadership conference will continue throughout the week with a "build your own adventure" activity where students can attend various Annual Meeting sessions, workshops, and events.

Both Sides of the Peer Review—How to Conduct One and How to React to One
