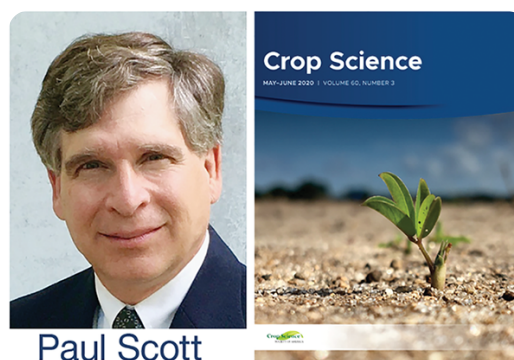

Crop Science: Paul Scott

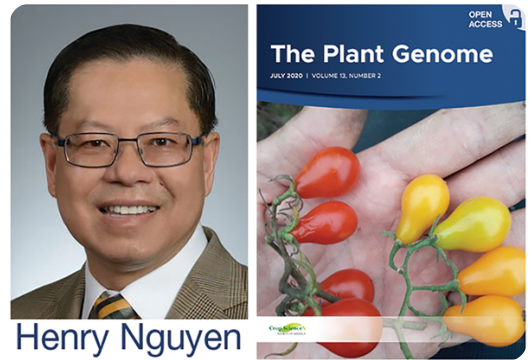
Dr. Scott is a research geneticist with USDA and 10+ year member of CSSA and ASA.

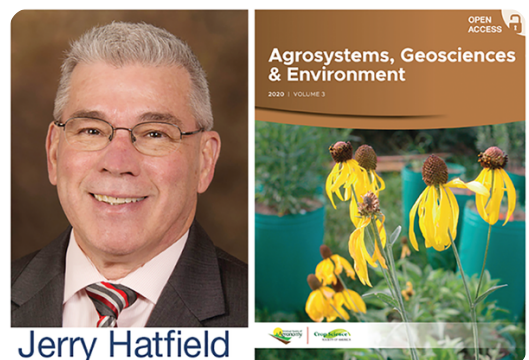
